ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

United States Team

The top-10 U.S. players who earned the most official PGA TOUR money beginning with the 2007 Wyndham Championship through the 2009 PGA Championship, weighted as follows:

2007-2008	\$1 = 1 point
2009	\$1 = 2 points

Plus two captain's selections

International Team

The top-10 international players (*excluding those eligible for the European Ryder Cup team*) from the Official World Golf Ranking through the 2009 PGA Championship, plus two captain's selections.

FORMAT

The Presidents Cup competition consists of 34 matches - 11 foursomes (alternate shot) and 11 four-ball (better ball) matches.

There are 12 singles matches involving all players on the final Sunday. All matches are worth one point each, for a total of 34 points. There are no playoffs for foursomes or four-ball, with each side receiving ½ point. Singles matches all square after 18 holes will to go extra holes until a team winner is determined. In a change inspired by the events of The Presidents Cup 2003, if the match is deadlocked at the end of singles play, the competition will be deemed a tie and the teams will share The Presidents Cup.

TELEVISION COVERAGE

The event will be broadcast to more than 500 million households in more than 200 countries worldwide. Specific broadcast times will be announced at a later date.

PURSE

Unlike other events, the players do not receive prize money based on performance. Instead, net proceeds are divided into equal shares among the players, captains and captains' assistants to donate to their favorite charities through PGA TOUR Charities, Inc.
